Awaken in us a sense of wonder, gratitude, and hope. Instil in us a yearning for justice, reconciliation, and peace.

A period of silence will be kept. You are invited to hold before God in prayer anything that weighs upon your heart this day. This time of prayer and reflective silence will conclude with the Lord's Prayer (sung).

Our Father in heaven, holy be your name. Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. Do not put us to the test; but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.
